

**PUBLICATION OF SECOND EDITION OF LOCAL PROCUREMENT LIST IN  
ACCORDANCE WITH THE MINERALS AND MINING (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 2012  
(L.I. 2173)**

Under the Minerals and Mining (General) Regulations, 2012, (L.I. 2173), mine support service providers, holders of mineral rights and holders of licence to export or deal in minerals are required to submit a 5-year Procurement Plan to the Minerals Commission for approval.

The 5-year Procurement Plan to be submitted shall specify the following:

- a) Targets for local procurement covering at least the items specified in the local procurement list as provided for in the regulation;
- b) Prospects for local procurement;
- c) Specific support to providers or suppliers;
- d) Other measures to develop the supply of local goods and services, including broadening access to opportunities and technical and financial assistance.

In the preparation of the Procurement Plans, companies are required to take into account the requirements of a Local Procurement List of goods and services with Ghanaian content, which the Commission shall make available annually to the mining industry.

The introduction of the Local Procurement List is to ensure that goods and services which are locally available in adequate quantities and at an optimal price and meet the appropriate safety and quality standards are patronised by the mining industry with the view to promoting the growth of the economy, in particular in the manufacturing sector, reducing imports and creating employment for Ghanaians.


Working together with the Chamber of Mines and other stakeholders, the Minerals Commission developed the First Edition of the Local Procurement List (2013) which comprises eight (8) goods/products to be procured in Ghana. The first edition of the List was published in January, 2014.

Working again with all stakeholders, the Minerals Commission has identified additional eleven (11) goods/products to be included in the Local Procurement List. These additional goods/products together with the earlier eight goods/products constitute the Second Edition of the Local Procurement List (2015). This Second Edition of the List is hereby attached.

Effective 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2016, holders of mineral rights, mine support service providers and holders of licence to export or deal in minerals are required to comply with this publication.

The appropriate sanctions for breaches with respect to non-submission of reports on the implementation of Procurement Plans by companies operating in the mining sector have been provided under Regulation 2 of L.I. 2173. The penalties to be levied in addition to the requirement to pay the full customs import duties on goods on the Local Procurement List which will be imported by mineral right holders shall be as specified in the schedule below. The penalties shall be paid to the Minerals Commission.

In due course, the Minerals Commission will begin engagement with other stakeholders to produce an improved Third Edition which should be ready by December, 2017.
